Free shuttle bus service

Free shuttle bus service and reception of waste water for cruise vessels in Turku

As in the past few cruise seasons TURKU is again offering free shuttle bus service between the pier and the city centre at regular intervals throughout the cruise vessel's stay in Turku. This gesture has been well received by crews and passengers alike. The distance between the port and the city centre is about 1,8 miles or 3 km.

A new offer for cruise vessels is free reception of waste water at the Port of Turku during 2010 and 2011. This is the port's environmental contribution to improving the state of the Baltic Sea. The waste water will be transported by tanker to a specific collection point at the port area for further delivery to the city sewage treatment plant.
